

Keynote: "The Balancing Act: Balancing Your Home and Work Life".

By Dick O'Brien, a professional speaker and a consultant in human relations. He has held senior management positions in government and business. Mr. O'Brien has been assisting corporations, school boards, hospitals and police departments with issues of stress, wellness, counseling and leadership.



Mr. O'Brien's keynote address will focus on maintaining the effectiveness level of the employee at work by empowering them at home. Mr. O'Brien will explore the underlying cause of lack of balance: (1) the gradual erosion of priorities, (2) the illusion of someone else in control and (3) the inability to focus on action. A major problem today is juggling time, energy and priorities into the balance between home and work life. Balance is difficult for all people but when a reasonable balance is not maintained, serious personal problems result.
